Description

Ancestral carved wooden food hook - Sepik River Papua New Guinea, circa 1900

This piece would hang from the ceiling for suspending baskets that contained food or valuables to protect them from rodents or other pests.

Sepik River food hooks, crafted by indigenous peoples of Papua New Guinea, are traditional wooden tools used for hanging or storing food. Often intricately carved with symbolic patterns or figures, these hooks reflect the artistic and cultural practices of the Sepik River region, blending functionality with spiritual and communal significance.
