A handsome pair of late 19th-century opera glasses, made for the gentleman who wished to see-and be seen-at the theatre, opera, or racecourse. Compact, elegant, and unmistakably of their period, they offer a charming glimpse into the rituals of Victorian and Edwardian social life.

Opera glasses were an essential accessory for the well-dressed theatre-goer, providing a closer view of the stage from the comfort of a private box or auditorium seat. Beyond their practical purpose, they were an expression of taste and status: finely made personal objects carried to the opera, concert hall, and other fashionable public occasions.

This pair has the pleasing proportions and refined character associated with late 19th-century optical instruments. Their small scale makes them easy to hold and display, while their period design gives them a strong decorative appeal. Whether used as intended or placed in a library, dressing room, study, or cabinet of curiosities, they bring an immediate sense of old-world theatre and ceremony.
