Description

A handsome early 20th-century Japanned side table, finished in a rich cinnabar-red lacquer and dating to circa 1910. Compact in scale yet highly decorative, it has a shaped top above slender cabriole legs, giving the piece an elegant, lightly exotic silhouette.

The vivid red ground is characteristic of the European fascination with East Asian lacquerwork, known as Japanning. Developed as a Western interpretation of Asian lacquer techniques, Japanned furniture became prized for its lustrous colour, decorative depth, and ability to bring a note of drama to an interior. Here, the warm cinnabar tone creates a particularly striking effect, complementing the graceful, curving profile of the legs.

The table's design balances decorative charm with practical versatility. Its modest proportions make it ideal beside an armchair, sofa, or bed, while its richly coloured surface gives it enough presence to work as an accent piece in a hall, drawing room, library, or dressing room. The cabriole legs add a pleasing sense of movement and reinforce the table's traditional decorative character.

A stylish and unusual piece of early 20th-century furniture, offering the enduring appeal of lacquered decoration with a sophisticated Edwardian-era sensibility. It would sit beautifully within both traditional and eclectic interiors, whether used individually or layered with other antiques and decorative objects.
