## Description

A pavé setting is a popular jewellery design where small, closely set gemstones are embedded into the metal, creating a surface that appears to "pave" the piece with sparkling stones. Typically used for diamonds, this technique enhances brilliance while minimising visible metal. The stones are secured with tiny prongs or beads, offering a seamless, elegant look.

Pavé settings are commonly seen in rings, bracelets, and pendants, adding a luxurious and sophisticated touch to any jewellery piece.
