Description

A pair of Edwardian Rococo style silver salts and silver spoons hallmarked for Birmingham 1906 with maker's mark IL.

Rococo style silver reflects the elegance and playful refinement of the Rococo movement. Characterised by asymmetry, fluid curves, and naturalistic motifs, these silver pieces often feature shells, scrolls, foliage, and delicate floral patterns.

Unlike the grandeur of Baroque silver, Rococo emphasises lightness, grace, and intimate luxury. Craftsmen produced ornate teapots, candelabra, snuffboxes, and serving pieces designed to complement lavish interiors. The style flourished in France and spread across Europe, with master silversmiths blending artistry and functionality.

Rococo silver remains highly prized today, valued for its intricate detail, exquisite craftsmanship, and its embodiment of refined aristocratic taste.
