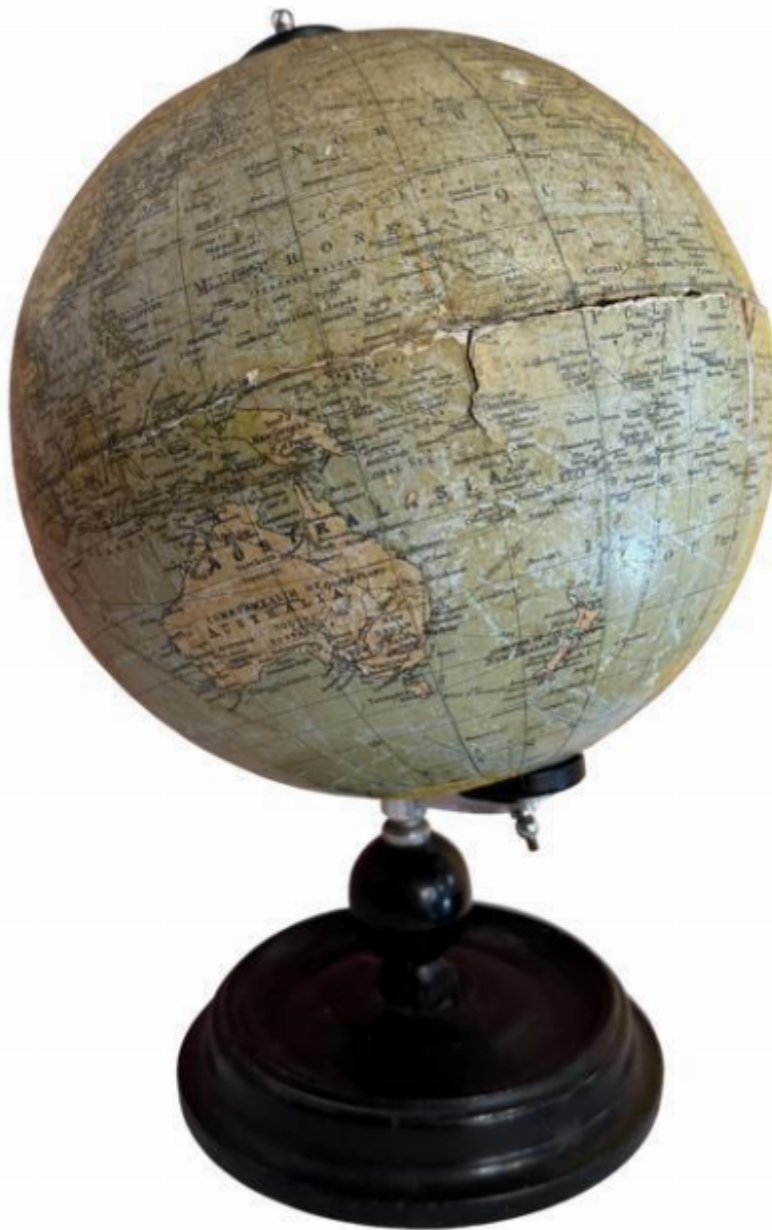


1930s Philips 8 inch British Empire papier-mâché globe
