Typically featuring elegant, fluted edges or intricate patterns, they often graced formal dining tables during meals.

Their transparent or ornate designs highlighted the vibrant green of celery, a luxury item then. Today, celery vases are cherished antiques, admired for their historical significance and aesthetic appeal.
