

Pair of Gothic Revival Brass Ecclesiastical Candlesticks, Circa 1850

Description

*A handsome and richly detailed pair of mid-19th-century Gothic Revival brass ecclesiastical candlesticks, dating to circa 1850. Designed in the spirit of medieval church metalwork, they have a commanding architectural presence and would originally have been intended for use upon an altar, in a chapel, or within another devotional setting.

Each candlestick is beautifully formed with a tall, twisting stem, rising from a substantial spreading base and supporting a broad candle socket. The design draws on the verticality and ornament of Gothic architecture, with crisp decorative detailing that gives the pair an impressive sense of rhythm and proportion. Their warm brass surfaces have developed a pleasing depth of colour over time, enhancing the sculptural quality of the casting.

Produced during the height of the Victorian Gothic Revival, these pieces reflect the period's renewed interest in medieval craftsmanship and ecclesiastical design. Inspired by the forms of earlier church furnishings, they combine a sense of historicism with the confident workmanship of the 19th century.

Presented as a pair, they offer considerable decorative impact. They would make a distinguished addition to an antique lighting collection, a Gothic Revival interior, or an ecclesiastical setting, and would look especially effective on a mantelpiece, dining table, sideboard, or altar.
